Important Notes:

- All ARCs are closed to new applications
- Registrar pre-enrolls all ARC students in their fall (prior to IntroDUCKtion), winter, and spring term courses unless they have an unresolved registration hold
- **ARC Seminars:** Students completing four credits in UGST 111 (Arts & Letters), UGST 112 (Social Science), or UGST 113 (Science) over the course of their first year (typically 1 credit in fall, 1 credit in winter, and 2 credits in spring) will earn one course toward the corresponding General Education Group Area requirement
- Faculty instructing ARC Seminars may establish any grading option: P/NP only, Graded Only, or Graded Option
- ARC students have selected their roommates and rooms prior to IntroDUCKtion

How to drop an ARC:

Students wanting to withdraw from or drop their ARC seminar will need to update their University Housing application. Once a student has updated the community section on the application to “I no longer wish to be part of an ARC/RC”, the ARC course(s) will be removed from their schedule in the afternoon of the next business day. Once students have updated their housing application they will be able to log back in to change their room or roommate, if they so choose, to any available space or can

stay in the room they have selected during the ARC selection process. Questions about the housing application, rooms, roommates and courses and concerns about ARC courses can be directed to the University Housing information table on Day 1, the University Housing office, via email to housing@uoregon.edu or ARCs@uoregon.edu, or by phone to 541-346-4277. Additional assistance can be found at the FIG registration table if students need to drop their ARC seminar immediately. (Students wanting to drop the ARC seminar at the FIG table can have their registration updated by the registrar staff. The names and UOIDs for those students who drop their ARC seminars at the FIG table will need to be emailed to ARCs@uoregon.edu). Students should still update their housing application to “I am no longer interested in an ARC/RC”, University Housing will email students instructions when they choose to drop the ARC seminar at the FIG table.
