## ✖ Bachelor of Arts Second-Language

You must attain satisfactory completion (C-/P or better) of at least the third term, second year of a second-language course taught in the language.

There are many ways to satisfy this requirement. Please consult Academic Advising or your major departmental advisor to identify a sequence that best matches your unique academic needs.

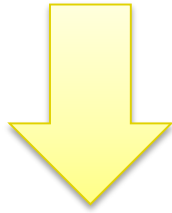
